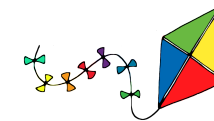

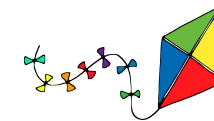

Homework

- Reading Eggs - there are series of books and related questions to support reading development appropriate to reading age. The tasks should be accessed regularly across the year. Learners also have access to a range of books through the classroom library and can take these home at any time and review them in their planners
- Reading & Spelling tasks - will be assigned on Reading Eggs every week. Learners will have to complete assigned tasks prior to accessing the other facilities on Reading Eggs. Focused spelling lists will be posted on Google Classroom.
- J2 Blast through HWB is a great way to practise quick mental maths recall.
- Numeracy worksheets set to support in class learning. All class-based tasks can also be accessed at home for revision purposes if required.
- Project work - this will be set throughout the year for pupils to complete at home.

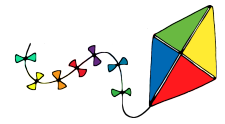
